CARA BRIGGS 5 POINT PLAN TO REFORM THE DA'S OFFICE

1. Restore competence and professionalism to the DA's Office by recruiting experienced prosecutors and implementing a training program for the large quantity of inexperienced prosecutors.
2. Improve trial results by ending the practice of assigning homicide and violent felony cases to inexperienced prosecutors.
3. Create a Vulnerable Victims Unit to aggressively prosecute those who prey on our children and senior citizens and to protect victims of domestic violence, stalking and sexual assault.
4. Create a Career Criminal Bureau to aggressively pursue repeat offenders and put an end to leniency for parole and probation violators who commit new crimes.
5. Restore integrity to the DA's Office by ending plea bargains that are influenced by personal or political connections.
